

Summary of Grantee Technical Assistance

The Colorado Trust's Health Professions Initiative, a three-year (2005-2008), \$10.2 million effort, provides funding for programs that are working to increase the number of health professionals in Colorado. These 21 programs focus on increasing education, training and advancement opportunities for underserved individuals from diverse backgrounds including those from rural areas. The aim is to increase the number of individuals in health professions in Colorado in all disciplines (primary, mental and dental health care professionals, as well as pharmacists), by stimulating partnerships among community-based organizations, schools and health professionals, and supporting certification of foreign-born health care professionals now living in Colorado.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

The Colorado Area Health Education Centers (AHEC) System is providing technical assistance and consultation services for the Health Professions Initiative grantees. Since 1977, the Colorado AHEC System has served as an academic-community partnership network serving designated regions of the state. The mission of the Colorado AHEC System is to improve the quality and accessibility of education for health care personnel in Colorado in order to enhance the delivery of health care services throughout the state, with special emphasis on frontier, rural and urban communities, and minority populations. The statewide AHEC system director and the regional AHEC executive directors conducted focused interviews with the 21 grantees, identified their challenges and designed technical assistance work plans according to their assessed needs. Each regional AHEC office staffs education and organization development experts who can provide local assistance and consultation support for grantees.
