Thank you for agreeing to respond to this survey about your community's collaboration experience as part of The Colorado Trust's Partnerships for Health Initiative. The Partnerships for Health Initiative is designed to help improve the coordination of health services at the community level. This initiative, part of The Trust's Colorado Healthy People 2010 Initiative, supports 13 community health partnerships statewide, consisting of local health departments, community-based organizations, government agencies and community members.

The Colorado Trust has contracted with TriWest Group to conduct an evaluation of this initiative, and we would like your cooperation in answering questions about the implementation process undertaken by the partner agencies in your community over the past year. A. Process of Collaboration

When you rate the following items, you should be thinking of the group of partners that your community formed to address one of more Healthy People 2010 goals under the Partnerships for Health Initiative of The Colorado Trust.

There are no right or wrong answers to the items below. Regardless of what you think, you can be sure that there are others who will agree with you. Please rate all of the items. If you are unsure about how to respond, you have the option to select "Don't Know." You may also select "Not Applicable" for those items that do not apply to you or your group at this time. When you have finished each page, please look back over the items one more time, to see if you have left any items unrated. Please respond by selecting the option on each scale that best represents your evaluation of the partnership process.
