




World Health Organization: Social Determinants of Health

The *social determinants of health* are the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work, age, including the health system. These circumstances are shaped by the *distribution of money, power and resources* at a global, national and local levels.


Public health is what we, as a society, do collectively through organized actions to assure the conditions in which all people can be healthy.

Community Organizing


A set of disciplined and strategic practices to build democratic and collective power to assure the conditions in which a community or communities can thrive.

- Theory of Change Grounded in Building <u>Power</u> to make change



Faithful tell Dayton: Erase gaps

· As the recount winds down, a coalition of church and religious groups urged the front-runner to work from the governor's office toward educational and economic opportunity for all.

All but declared the next governor of Minnesota, DFLer Mark Dayton on Sunday promised a gathering of more than 1,500 Minnesotans of faith to strive to make the state a place of equal opportunity for all.

"That's my commitment," Dayton said at the Minneapo-In Convention Center to members and representatives of about 100 churches and religious organizations from around the state. "I share that [vision] with you. Now let's go do it."


Dayton's comment, which drew a standing ovation, came at an event that was part religious revival gathering and part political and economic forum.
