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

### So, Why Opioids?

- Colorado lost 108 people to an opioidrelated overdose in 1999.
- That number hit an all-time high of 504 lives lost due to an opioid in 2016.



Rates for heroin and prescription drugs are highest for **non-Hispanic** white Coloradans.




Males more likely to die of a heroin overdose than females.


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







# Prescription Opioid and Heroin-Related Death Rates, 1999-2016









Rx opioid deaths down slightly (329 in 2015, 300 in 2016)

Heroin deaths (160 in 2015, 228 in 2016)

Fentanyl deaths (41 in 2015, 49 in 2016)

Methadone deaths (34 in 2015, 56 in 2016)

Net Gain for all Opioids 472 in 2015 vs 504 in 2016




#### Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR)

# ALTERNATIVE TREATMENTS TO OPIOIDS FOR PAINFUL CONDITIONS (ALTO)

How many of us prescribe alternatives for pain?

- Ketamine
- Toraldol
- Haldol
- Gabapentin
- Trigger-point injections
- Lidocaine drips/Lidoderm patches
- DDAVP
- Nitrous oxide
- Nerve blocks
- Physical Therapy Acupuncture
- TENS Units
- Cognative Behavioral Therapy



# TREATMENT OF ADDICTED PATIENTS AND REFERRAL

We can do more to stop the epidemic.

- How well do we facilitate MAT referrals?
- How many of us have initiated Suboxone in the ED?
- Do we do a good job helping our addicted patients?
- PCP Manage Addiction, RX Suboxone



- Start patients on MAT Subuxone Waiver?
- Have Special Rules for OUD Patient No Opioids! No Procedures
- Hospitals Start patients on MAT




